December means basically two things in County Hall; the Christmas break is nearly here, and the Welsh Government budget - and hence the settlement grant figure to PCC will be revealed. What this means is that nearly 80% of Council income comes from this grant and the remainder from Council tax and income from chargeable services. However, the grant increase this year at the time of writing this is likely to be very small, and nowhere near the amount required to cover the spiralling cost to provide basic services. That gap will, as usual, have to be bridged by either substantial Council Tax increases or a reduction in services or a combination of both.

The recent storms have been challenging for all residents with much disruption and damage. However we are all still here to tell the tale and it is fantastic how our community works together to get through these events. Special thanks must go out to the National Grid staff and our Council employees who worked so hard to get our power back on and our roads open.



Concerns have been raised to me by drivers trying to exit Panteg Lane opposite the Memorial Hall in regards to lack of visibility due to parked cars on the area used for parking opposite the hall. Suggestions were made for hatched lines to encourage parking further from the road to give better visibility. The matter was discussed at Solva CC meeting and whilst the issue could be seen, there would be a problem enforcing no parking on the lines and there is a general lack of parking in Solva anyway so it was felt best that no lines were added.

On a similar note, I have been made aware of the rather poor parking at the entrance to Anchor Down. Community co-operation is the best way to address this issue. Please can I appeal to drivers to park so that a Fire Engine or Ambulance can access all the estate at all times and to not park on the pavement.

Finally it just remains for me to wish all residents a Merry Christmas and a Happy and Healthy New Year and thank everyone for their support in the last year.

As you are all aware our St Davids Waste and Recycling Centre has been saved. Although it's losing a day in the Summer, it will continue to be open 2 days a week all through the year. There is some work needed to be done at the site which is required. I can't thank you all for your support and keeping up the fight for saving our Tip so I now urge you all to please please continue to use it as we don't ever want to be in this situation again.

The weeks leading up to Christmas were an extremely busy time for staff and pupils of Ysgol Penrhyn Dewi so I would like to thank them for their contribution to community life here in St Davids. They took part in the Festival of Christmas Trees, lighting Ceremony, performing at the Senior Citizens lunch, these are just a few events. Diolch yn fawr i chi gyd.

There has been a lot of concern from parents of pupils who attend the Nons Campus in Nun street St Davids during the end of the school day. There is concern with regard to the safe crossing of the road. I am in close contact with parents PCC regarding this issue. PCC do though work very hard with the pupils regarding Pedestrian Safety and will continue to do so by delivering assemblies, classroom sessions and completing kerb craft refresher training.

Pot holes in Bryn Road have been a big issue this year and I am pleased to inform you that from Monday 27th January from the junction with the access to Maes Yr Hedydd west to its junction with Mitre Lane the road will be closed for three days for carriageway resurfacing works.

Phase one of the new Glasfryn development is on track and PCC are working towards the end of January to hold an open day for the residents. Date not yet confirmed.

A big thank you goes out to all services and PCC for all their hard work and support during the recent storm Darragh in December.

Phone lines are open 8.00am – 6.30pm. Main Surgery line is: 01437 721306. We are closed at weekends and Bank Holidays. When we are closed, emergency cover is available by phoning NHS 111 to access the Out of Hours Service. For anything life-threatening, patients are to dial 999.



Building works – Over the next few weeks you may see Contractors carrying out maintenance work inside and outside of the Surgery. We will endeavour to keep disruption to a minimum, please bear with us whilst we carry out this necessary work.

NHS APP – We are changing from using My Health On-line to the NHS Wales APP. Patients can access services such as ordering repeat prescriptions and booking some appointments, by logging into: <https://app.nhs.wales/>

To access the NHS Wales APP services, you must:

- be registered with a GP practice in Wales
- have a fully verified NHS login
- be aged 16 or over

Repeat Prescription requests – Please contact the Surgery to order your prescription 7-10 days before your medication is required. Order your prescription online via the NHS APP or post your repeat slip directly to the surgery. You can also nominate your preferred pharmacy and ask the surgery to send your prescription to one of the Pharmacies that has a collection service from Solva.

Flu Vaccination – Our flu clinics are open! Please ring the surgery to book an appointment. Eligibility for the 2024 to 2025 this autumn and winter, as part of our winter respiratory vaccination programme include:

- children aged two and three years on 31 August 2024
- people aged 6 months to 64 years in a clinical risk group
- people aged 65 years and older (age on 31 March 2025)
- pregnant women
- Registered carers of a person whose health or welfare may be at risk if the carer falls ill
- frontline health and care workers
- people experiencing homelessness
- household contacts of the immunocompromised



If you are an adult in a risk group, are pregnant, or are aged 65 or over, you can get your flu vaccine here at the Surgery.

Children's flu (nasal) vaccination – If you have yet to book your child in, please contact the surgery to make an appointment.

COVID Booster Vaccination campaign – We continue to

vaccinate eligible patients. This vaccination can be given at the same time as your flu vaccination. Eligibility for 2024 to 2025 this autumn and winter includes:-

- *People aged 6 months to 64 years with a long-term health condition (which includes pregnant women and people with a weakened immune system)
- Residents in a care home for older adults
- People aged 65 years and older (age on 31 March 2025)
- Unpaid carers
- Frontline health and social care workers
- Staff working in care homes for older adults

"The Festival of Christmas Trees committee would like to thank everyone who helped over the three-day event, especially to the groups and individuals who enters into the competition," said Chairman Bethan Thomas Price. The Christmas Tree Association also thanked all those who volunteered on the Saturday night switch on and especially the members of St Davids Penknife Club who were marshals for the evening and also organised the safe arrival of Santa to St Davids.



Meanwhile in Solva, the Shopping Under the Stars evening was another success with plenty of people filling the shops

and pubs. Santa made an appearance in the Hats and Barrels, to the delight of local children, and all the traders produced beautifully decorated stalls filled with crafts, food and drink to get everyone in the mood for Christmas.

Peatland restoration project continues

A £5m national peatland restoration project has undertaken an important piece of work at a site in Pembrokeshire. Dowrog Common Nature Reserve, located outside of St Davids, is a 101 hectare Site of Special Scientific Interest (SSSI) and part of the North Pembrokeshire Commons SAC, managed by the Wildlife Trust of South and West Wales.

The reserve is a focus of the EU funded LIFE project called LIFEquake which is supported by Welsh Government and delivered in Pembrokeshire as a partnership between Pembrokeshire Coast National Park Authority, National Trust and Wildlife Trust of South and West Wales.

Peatland is the most valuable land resource in Wales as it stores 30% of land-based carbon. Covering about 4% of Wales, it is estimated that 90% of Welsh peatland is in a deteriorating condition and emitting greenhouse gasses that contribute to climate change.

The LIFEquake project aims to restore peatland, quaking bogs and their wider supporting wetland landscapes to favourable conservation status. Quaking bogs – so called because when conditions are right the ground ‘quakes’ underfoot.

To manage the habitat at Dowrog Common, LIFEquake and project partners have already installed fencing which will bring back historic grazing of livestock on the site. Grazing helps to maintain the right levels of vegetation on wetland sites which allow the important “bog building” plants and mosses to thrive. The next project action taking place at Dowrog Common will be the scraping of areas dominated by unwanted surface vegetation and superficial enriched peat, allowing the redevelopment of quaking bog in the shallow pools that are left behind. These “scrapes” effectively mimic the conditions which have led to the development of quaking bogs in the past in other parts of Wales.

The work commenced in early November and is expected to be completed in just a few weeks. For updates on the work and the recovery of the Dowrog Common habitat, follow LIFEquake via the project website Natural Resources Wales / LIFE Quaking Bogs and on their social media @LIFE Quaking Bogs.



***The former Scout Hall in St Davids is to be saved for the community! ***

The former Scout Hall in St Davids is to be saved for the community! St Davids City Councillors have voted that the City Council shall take over the much loved St Davids Scout Hut. This is to be made possible by a Community Asset Transfer of the land it is sited on, from Pembrokeshire County Council, for zero rent, for 125 years. In turn the Scouting Association have pledged to gift the building to the community, into the guardianship of the City Council. This has been a long time in the planning and was proposed by The St Davids Befrienders when they set up a men’s and subsequent people’s shed in the building. Recently the Befrienders group secured a grant from PAVS, funded from the government through the Shared Prosperity Fund. The grant aptly named ‘Doing the small things’ echoing the words of St David, has helped to engage the community by having events and workshops to help boost the use of the building and grow volunteer support.

City Councillor Becky Lloyd said ‘The building has gone from strength to strength and community use has more than tripled from just 6 hrs per week! Volunteers have worked so hard, clearing, fixing and painting and local businesses have provided free services and donations. Everyone has pulled together and there’s now such a buzz about the building. New life has been breathed into it the hall with things like pilates classes, life-drawing, band practices, women’s joinery classes and private party bookings! The summer BBQ event and raffle was great as the sun even shone and we had lots of local stakeholders supporting it like ATEB and PCC

Housing. St Davids City Council sponsored a Children's Circus Workshop and the Penknife Club free icecreams for local children on the surrounding estates. A name your building exercise was started at the event, and continued online on social media, where the winning name was announced as **'Ty Pawb'**.

A new group is being formed as a management group to lease the building from the City Council going forward. The building has lots of things going on and also has availability for bookings.


