This month I want to return to the subject of 2nd home premium. At the start of the new financial year new Council tax demands were issued. Most of us saw an increase by about 12.5% but those classed as 2nd homes saw a rise of about 75% to their already double bills as the premium rose by 100% and the general increase of 12.5% was applied to the total. That gives a band E 2nd home in Solva around a £7000 Council tax bill.

The initial reason for introducing a 2nd homes premium in 2017 was to provide a source of funds to offset the effects of 2nd homes on the community. The initial rate was 50% and most of that was earmarked for the building of affordable rental housing. 4.5 years ago Solva was allocated £3m to build 18 such homes and whilst the scheme is still happening it is painfully slow. However, since then the Cabinet has changed the scheme to a 200% premium with only 11.5% being allocated to affordable housing. The general PCC fund now swallows up the lion's share of the cash collected from 2nd homes owners. So what is a 2nd home? It is a domestic house that is not lived in by its owner as their main home. Most people perceive that they are houses owned by people who live outside Pembrokeshire for their own holidays and are partly occupied in the summer months. This is not the case and whilst the above is partially true they can also be properties owned by local people who have bought them as an investment, developed them from outbuildings or even inherited them and now rent them out for holiday lets as a source of additional income. Whilst 2nd homes are generally seen as damaging to a community in that they compete with local people for housing, in my view holiday lets do have a lot of merit in that they bring business to Solva and those are fresh faces each week that generate income and hence sustain employment. Another fact that is often overlooked is that 2nd homeowners are not only charged triple council tax but also triple Community Council precept and triple Police precept. The Community Council charge stays in Solva and my understanding is that it helps to reduce all the full-time resident's contributions. The Police precept, which to many 2nd homes is in excess of £1200 is used throughout the Dyfed Powys Police Force area and subsidises homes in all 4 counties that DPP serves. In my view this is wrong. There is however a get-out clause in that genuine holiday properties can transfer to Business rates and qualify for Small Business Relief hence paying zero. To do this, they must demonstrate 182 days minimum letting in the last financial year. Sadly with a poorer letting year in 2023, many have not achieved the 182 days or have slipped back into domestic rates and face a £7k rates bill that will wipe out much or all of the summer holidays takings. This is a Welsh Government directive, not PCC. Also if a 2nd home is offered for sale, it gets a temporary 12-month relief from the premium. My view is 100% premium is enough and what is raised must be ploughed back into communities as houses for affordable rent. Any extra Police precept should stay within the Community. Whilst there may be little sympathy for those owners with the luxury of a holiday home there is no need to use them as a cash cow. This is a blunt instrument and any measure that damages local business in my view is wrong. This Council should be using as much cash as possible to build affordable housing, which needs to be the absolute priority.

D-DAY 80TH Solva Event

6th June 2024.

How many troops took part on D-Day?

On Tuesday 6th June 1944 Allied forces mounted the largest amphibious invasion the world has ever witnessed. Operation Overlord saw around 7,000 ships and landing craft set down about 156,000 troops on the five beaches along a carefully selected stretch of the Normandy coast.

Shortly after midnight on the 6th of June, three US and British airborne divisions, more than 23,000 men, took off to secure the flanks of those beaches.

On D-Day alone, as many as 4,400 troops died from the combined Allied forces. Some 9,000 were wounded or missing.

THE BLUETITS CHILL SWIMMERS

Sian Richardson, from Pembrokeshire, founded 'The Bluetits Chill Swimmers', a global community of over 120,000 people regularly taking part in social cold water swimming sessions and outdoor adventures.

Following years of partaking in physical challenges including triathlons and marathons, Sian wanted to take on a new challenge and decided to try cold water swimming. Finding that she was gradually being joined by others who didn't want to swim alone, she created the 'Bluetits Chill Swimmers' in 2014, providing a safe and inclusive space for people to safely explore the physical and mental benefits of outdoor swimming.

Since then, Sian has grown the community into a social enterprise which also supports members to gain coaching and water qualifications by reinvesting funds raised into the 'Bluetit Bursary'.

Sian speaks at events across the UK about non-competitive swimming, water safety, and coaching and is currently working on an 'Introduction to Open Water Immersion and Water Safety Course', which members will have access to, once accredited.

Congratulating Sian on her award, the Secretary of State for Wales, the Rt Hon David TC Davies, said:

"Congratulations to Sian on her Points of Light Award. She has made a fantastic contribution to her community in Pembrokeshire, encouraging people to experience the benefits of cold water swimming by creating a social and supportive club. And she has done a brilliant job of spreading the word about water safety and helping others gain important qualifications. I'm delighted that her work has been recognised."

The Rt Hon Stephen Crabb, Sian's local MP for Preseli Pembrokeshire, said:

ST DAVIDS AND DEWISLAND HISTORICAL SOCIETY

For our April meeting, we welcomed Simon Hancock, Curator of Haverfordwest Museum, who gave a very informative talk on Women in Pembrokeshire during World War I. Simon considered both the national picture and the local one, where society was somewhat more conventional and conservative. Initially women, encouraged by government publicity, played a part in encouraging their menfolk to enlist but were then affected by rising food prices causing them to make household economies or take direct action such as against a 100% increase in bread prices at Fishguard.

The Voluntary Aid Detachment presented more job opportunities, especially for nurses, many leaving Pembrokeshire to go to large British hospitals, the Western Front, or Palestine. Others took over men's jobs such as motor drivers, railway porters, and clerks in banks and shops. The Red Cross organised Knitting for the Troops with 30 such groups in Pembrokeshire and the £150 million raised by war charities was mainly collected by women. Many women worked locally, and further afield, in the munitions industry with 500 women at H.M. Pembroke Dock by 1918 including in the Boiler Shop. Our next talk is on Monday 13th May when James January-McCann will talk on Casglu Enwau Cymru/Collecting Welsh Place Names. James is Place Names Officer for Wales with the Royal Commission on the Ancient and Historical Monuments of Wales and maintains an online database of all such Welsh names to which our Society has contributed, and is continuing to do so through our Field Name Study Group. We invite everyone interested in all types of Welsh place names to join us at the City Hall, St Davids at 7.00 for a 7.30 start with admission for non-members £3.00.
